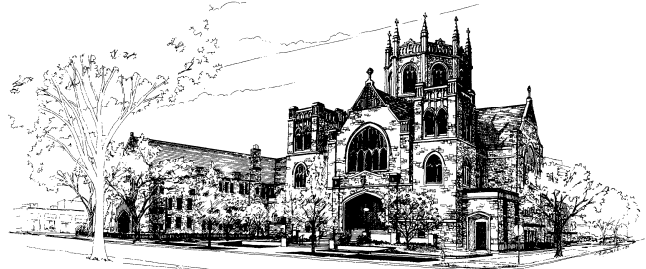

∞ From the Pastor's Desk ∞

“Follow Up to Growing Potatoes Luncheon”

Let me begin by saying, “What a wonderful Growing Potatoes Luncheon we had on September 17, 2017 following the EPIC worship service.” Personally, I want to thank Geri Doll and the Youth for providing an outstanding Potato Bar with all the fixings. It is not too late to donate to the Youth Group to offset expenses occurred on this past summer’s mission trip to Idaho. Also, I want to thank the Promote the Growth Team (Gale Farmer, Joanna Ediger, Tom Church, Stephanie Bird Hutchison, David Miller, Mary Knecht, and Michelle Murray Cline) for all your work leading up to the meeting and leading the meeting around three important questions. These three questions were intended to spark our imaginations and creativity as we begin to live into the future God has prepared for us. For those who were not there, the three questions that we had amazing discussions at each table were:

- 1) What do you find to be the most joyful expression of your spiritual life?
- 2) What would it look like for FPC to be family focused?
- 3) What would a re-configured sanctuary look like to serve us well year-round?



Each group then reported their findings to the large group and to the Promote Growth Team to be tabulated and collated (at a later date) around common themes to your answers. Once this has happened the Promote Growth Team will report to Session and to the congregation the next steps in addressing our adaptive challenge of growing the membership of First Presbyterian Church. In other words, becoming

the change we wish to see in our common life together. You are the stakeholders of First Presbyterian Church with its rich history. But we cannot live in the past. We must learn from the past, live in the present, and look to the future. God is not finished with us yet... but it will mean venturing forth in faith to follow the path God has laid out before us.

It has been said that ships are safest in the harbor but that is not what ships are built for. Likewise, Christians are safe when huddled together taking no risks in sharing the Good News. But this is not what Christians are called to do... we are called and commissioned by Jesus Christ “... to go and make disciples of all tribes, of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to obey all that I commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, till the end of the age” (Matthew 28:19-20). Our challenge is to journey from the safe and comfortable to venture forth with Jesus to share the Good News.

Speaking of future, I want to remind you that I will be going with Columbia Seminary to Germany to walk in the footsteps of Martin Luther’s life. I leave September 26 and will return October 7. Please keep me in your prayers as I will you. I look forward to sharing with you all that I learned in a future Wednesday night class.

Be Generous

"Now he who provides seed for sowing and bread for food will provide the seed for you to sow; he will multiply it and swell the harvest of your benevolence, and you will always be rich enough to be generous and produce thanksgiving to God."

II Corinthians 9:10-11

Putting the emphasis on seasons of stewardship instead of a stewardship season would create a culture in which seasons of stewardship would happen throughout the entire year much like the seasons of our planet where one season prepares us for the next and we reap the harvest in one season of the seeds that were planted and nurtured in previous seasons. WINTER (Discernment): A time for discernment and setting goals.

SPRING: (Direction): A time of awareness of the beauty of God's creation

SUMMER: (Development): A time for focusing on stewardship of time, including relaxation and regeneration.

FALL: (Dedication): A time for the Fall Pledge Campaign and also to focus on participation and involvement in the ministries God calls us to do.

We have a responsibility to respond to God's many gifts to us throughout the year, not only during the Dedication season. First Presbyterian Church is able to carry out this responsibility because of our financial support. Your generous contributions are vital and very appreciated.

According to a study from AARP, the state of Kansas ranks third, 37%, in the U.S. for the percentage of adults 65 and older who volunteer. Utah was first with 46%. The remaining states in the top five were Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Nebraska. Once again, the Economy Corner's August sales exceeded August 2016 sales by \$655.93. First Church's sales were \$7476.11 and Grace's were \$1630.42, for a total of \$9106.53. We filled 96 vouchers this month which are equivalent to \$1331.11 worth of basic clothing. First Church's portion was \$991.16 and Grace's was \$339.95. Please keep our needs in mind as you clean out and organize for winter. We appreciate your faithful support and donations which allow us to work toward fulfilling our Mission of providing low cost clothing and daily necessities to our urban Community.

What we've known as the Peacemaking Offering has been transformed into the Peace and Global Witness Offering. This offering, always received and dedicated on the first Sunday in October, World Communion Sunday, will have a great global reach, a significant impact and bring peace to people through Christ. Jesus told us, "Blessed are the Peacemakers...."

65.3 million people worldwide are in need. Mostly women and children, these people have fled their homes to escape violence and persecution. Now at the highest levels ever recorded, the global refugee crisis represents one of the greatest humanitarian needs around the world.

In Africa amid decades of fighting, nearly 4.5 million people have sought refuge from violence and famine in the Congo, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Kenya.

"We Choose Welcome" is a campaign to live out the Biblical call to welcome the stranger. Peace & Global Witness recipient ministries, the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program and the Presbyterian Ministry at the United Nations are among those collaborating to assist every level of the PC(USA) in this effort.
